A Note From The CEO

Over the last three and a half decades, Team Computers has grown beyond delivering IT solutions. We have grown into a responsibility toward people, animals, and the environment. This year alone, we reached more than 5,000 school children through education programs. We trained 1,000 inmates in digital literacy and accounting skills, helping many prepare for life after release. Our animal welfare initiatives ensured daily food for over 550 street animals and medical support through trusted partners.

In Almora, we planted **over 10,000 saplings**, restored traditional water systems for local families, and turned dry pine needles into biofuel, reducing forest fire risks while creating livelihoods. In Gurugram, solar installations brought clean energy to **650 people**. Through Apollo Telemedicine, **over 3,000 villagers** in Almora received accessible healthcare.

In many parts of Delhi, animals such as bullocks and horses are still used for pulling carts under physically punishing conditions, often without proper food, rest, or medical attention. This not only causes immense suffering to the animals but also reflects the lack of viable economic alternatives for cart-pullers.

In response to this, Team Computers partnered with PETA India to implement the Delhi Mechanization Project. The intervention involved the donation of 13 electric vehicles (EVs) to replace animal-drawn carts, thereby freeing working animals and offering a sustainable livelihood option to their owners.

This mechanization has led to the release of several animals into sanctuaries where they now live in safe, cruelty-free environments. At the same time, the EVs have empowered former cart owners by providing them with a more efficient, eco-friendly, and dignified source of income.

This project creates a dual impact by protecting animal welfare and promoting economic sustainability for marginalized communities.

Sterilization of Stray Dogs

Delhi faces a persistent issue with the growing stray dog population, which often leads to concerns over **public safety, spread of diseases, and the inhumane treatment of animals** due to overcrowding and lack of care.

In order to address this challenge in a humane and sustainable way, Team Computers collaborated with Friendicoes SECA to implement a mass sterilization program. The project **successfully sterilized 300 stray dogs** across the city, following ethical veterinary practices and ensuring the animals' post-operative recovery.

This targeted intervention not only helped in stabilizing the stray dog population but also significantly reduced incidents of aggression, health risks, and suffering due to uncontrolled breeding.

The program contributed to creating a more harmonious coexistence between humans and stray animals while aligning with our commitment to **SDG- 15 protecting animal life** and promoting responsible community welfare.

Government veterinary hospitals in Almora, Uttarakhand often face severe limitations in medical equipment and resources, which significantly hampers their ability to provide timely and effective care to injured and sick animals.

This deficiency leads to prolonged animal suffering and suboptimal treatment outcomes.

To bridge this critical gap, Team Computers undertook a direct intervention by donating essential medical equipment to government veterinary facilities in the region.

This strategic support has enhanced the operational capacity of these hospitals, enabling veterinarians to perform accurate diagnoses and administer treatments more efficiently and humanely.

As a result, over 500 animals have directly benefited from improved medical care, leading to better health outcomes and quicker recovery.

Small Animal Examination Table, Stethoscope, Stretchers, Mouth Gag for Small Animal, Mouth Gag for Large Animal, Drip Stand were provided.

In Meerut, Uttar Pradesh,

the absence of dedicated infrastructure for stray and abandoned animals has resulted in increased instances of cruelty, neglect, and poor living conditions for voiceless creatures.

Without adequate shelter, these animals face harsh weather, disease, starvation, and accidents, creating a pressing animal welfare crisis.

In response, Team Computers initiated the development of an animal care shelter through direct intervention.

This facility provides a safe and secure environment for stray and abandoned animals, offering them food, medical care, and rehabilitation. The intervention not only ensures the immediate protection and well-being of animals but also contributes to a more compassionate and responsible community.

Donation of Cow Lifting Equipment for Gaushalas

In many Gaushalas

across Uttar Pradesh and Delhi, caregivers regularly face the significant challenge of caring for injured, sick, or aging cows that are **unable to stand or move independently**. The absence of appropriate lifting equipment means these animals often endure prolonged pain, immobility, and face increased risks of secondary health complications, which can sometimes lead to premature death. Recognizing this urgent and often overlooked need,

Team Computers took direct action by donating three specialized cow lifting machines.

These machines have proven invaluable in safely lifting and supporting vulnerable cows during treatment or recovery, allowing caretakers to provide more effective and humane care.

This intervention has not only improved the quality of life and survival chances for these animals but has also significantly strengthened the emergency response and overall capacity of local shelters.

Through this support, Team Computers remains committed to promoting compassionate animal management and improving animal welfare standards in the region.

Feeding & Nutrition Support for Stray Animals

Under the thematic area of Animal Welfare, a comprehensive multi-location initiative on Feeding & Nutrition Support for Stray and Shelter Animals was implemented across Delhi, Gurugram, Ghaziabad, and Almore. The program was carried out with the support of partners including Kanak Foundation, Direct Intervention, and Gray Beards Cottage Foundation, addressing the pressing issue of hunger and malnutrition among stray animals and cattle.

Stray dogs and shelter animals in urban as well as semi-rural areas often struggle to find sufficient and hygienic food, leading to malnutrition, weakness, and increased vulnerability to disease. To counter this, structured feeding interventions were carried out, ensuring timely and nutritious meals while also supporting shelters in resource-scarce regions.



➤ In Delhi, over **400 stray dogs benefitted** from daily feeding drives organized with Kanak Foundation, ensuring consistent access to hygienic food.

➤ In **Ghaziabad, 10 stray dogs** received consistent and hygienic nutrition, stabilizing their health and well-being.

➤ In **Gurugram, Haryana, 175 stray dogs** were provided with regular meals under the guidance of Direct Intervention, significantly reducing their dependence on unsafe food sources.

➤ In **Almore, Uttarakhand, 50 cows at Macchor Gaushala were supported** with regular fodder through the Gray Beards Cottage Foundation, addressing scarcity in a resource-challenged hilly region.

In Almora, Uttarakhand, many cattle at Almora were not getting enough good food and were fed at irregular times. Because of this, their health became weak, and they often got sick. Many of these animals struggled to stay strong and active. To help them,

Team Computers started a special program to provide regular, nutritious meals to 50 cattle at the Gaushala.

This steady supply of good food has made a big difference - the animals are now stronger, healthier, and less likely to fall ill.

The program has also encouraged the caretakers and local community to pay more attention to the needs of these animals and take better care of them.

As a result, the cattle are more energetic and able to live better lives. This project is helping to improve the care and well-being of animals in the area and showing how small actions can make a big difference.

In Goa, the rising number of abandoned and stray animals has become a growing concern, exacerbated by lack of adequate infrastructure for rescue and rehabilitation.

These animals are often left exposed to harsh environmental conditions, malnutrition, and disease, severely impacting their survival and wellbeing.

To address this gap, Team Computers directly supported the construction of a dedicated animal shelter in Goa.

This facility was designed to accommodate over 50 animals,

providing them with a safe, hygienic, and nurturing environment. The intervention not only created a permanent sanctuary for rescued animals but also enabled timely medical treatment, improved recovery outcomes, and reduced mortality.

By providing a dignified space for the voiceless, the project contributes meaningfully to sustainable animal care and aligns with our commitment to SDG 15 – protecting life on land.

Access to Justice for Undertrials Prisoners

In many parts of India, particularly in states like Uttarakhand, underprivileged individuals and marginalized communities face serious challenges in accessing timely and fair legal support. Many undertrials, arrested for petty and non-heinous offenses, remain in prison due to a lack of legal awareness, proper representation, or financial mevexclusion and allows injustice to persist.

To help bridge this gap, we continued our partnership on the Access to Justice - Legal Aid and Rehabilitation Program during the financial year 2024-25 across District Jail Dehradun, District Jail Haridwar, and Sub Jail Haldwani.

The initiative provided free legal aid, conducted vulnerability assessments, and facilitated bail and release procedures. It also extended rehabilitation support to individuals after their release. Our teams worked closely with State Legal Services Authorities, prison departments, and the judiciary to build institutional partnerships and strengthen the justice delivery system. This collective effort aimed to promote fair access to justice and support individuals in rebuilding their lives with dignity.

As a result, **157 individuals** were released and **26 were rehabilitated** through targeted support and livelihood opportunities. These included:

This not only restored their **dignity** but also **facilitated their reintegration into society**. By ensuring access to justice and working toward socio-financial inclusion, the project is helping create a **more equitable legal ecosystem** for those most in need.

Manoj Bisht

Manoj Bisht, a 24-year-old from Haldwani, faced several challenges after being placed in preventive custody. Following his release, it was difficult for him to return to a normal life. He struggled to find a steady job and rebuild his future, a situation many people experience after encountering legal troubles.

He served simple, affordable food and treated every customer with kindness and respect. His warm, friendly environment and good service quickly won the hearts of local residents, turning many of them into regular customers. Thanks to his dedication and consistent efforts, Manoj began earning a steady income, which helped him regain financial independence and restore his confidence.

Manoj received valuable support through the Access to Justice -

Legal Aid and Rehabilitation Program.

The initiative provided him with legal advice, personal guidance, and financial assistance to help him start a small business.

In August 2024,

Manoj took a brave step by opening a roadside tea and fast food stall in a busy area of Haldwani.

Manoj's story highlights the importance of timely support and second chances for those looking to rebuild their lives. With the right encouragement and opportunities, people can overcome difficult circumstances and create a better future for themselves.

Today, Manoj stands as a symbol of hope, showing how meaningful change is possible when communities come together to offer support and trust.

In alignment with our long-term commitment to environmental sustainability, we formally initiated a strategic afforestation programme in FY 2023–24 in collaboration with the Village Panchayats of Jihar and Tarari in Almora, Uttarakhand. This initiative, which began in 2022 following a formal request from the local governance bodies, aims to rejuvenate degraded forest areas through community-led plantation drives under the Van Panchayat framework.

During FY 2024–25, a total of 10,000 native saplings were planted

as part of a targeted gap-filling initiative aimed at enhancing forest cover and supporting biodiversity restoration. To ensure effective post-plantation monitoring, we deployed our proprietary Plant Watch Pro application, an innovative digital tool designed to track growth metrics and survival rates through real-time data analytics.

In parallel, our team has implemented a combination of preventive and responsive measures to mitigate forest fire risks during the dry season,

addressing a critical ecological challenge in the region. Community engagement remains central to this initiative, with local manpower and volunteers playing a key role in plantation and maintenance activities. By fostering environmental stewardship and building local capacity, this program seeks to create a replicable model for participatory forest conservation and rural ecological resilience.

Forest fires caused by dry pine needles are a serious problem in the hilly areas of Uttarakhand, especially around Almora.

These fires not only damage the forests but also harm the plants, animals, and people living nearby.

To tackle this problem, we supported a special green energy project that collects dry pine needles from the forests and converts them into biofuel, a clean and renewable source of energy.

By removing these dry needles, the project helps reduce the risk of forest fires, protecting the environment and nearby communities.

At the same time, it creates new job opportunities for local people who collect and process the pine needles, helping them earn a livelihood. This initiative is a great example of how protecting environment and supporting local.

The Installation of Solar Power Plants for Renewable Energy project, implemented by Earth Saviours Foundation in Gurugram, Haryana, represents a significant step towards environmental sustainability and climate action.

By harnessing the power of the sun, the project not only lowers carbon emissions but also improves overall energy efficiency, aligning with Sustainable Development Goal 13 – Climate Action.

This initiative focuses on setting up solar power systems to provide clean, renewable energy for the Foundation's operational needs, thereby reducing dependence on conventional fossil fuel-based electricity.

Benefiting approximately 650 individuals,

this intervention supports both the local community and the environment by promoting green energy solutions that mitigate environmental degradation.

The project underscores our commitment to supporting innovative and sustainable approaches that contribute to long-term ecological balance while empowering organizations dedicated to social welfare and environmental protection.

Sustainable Livelihood Enhancement for Farmers

Farmers in hilly regions often face ongoing challenges such as low agricultural productivity, reliance on traditional farming methods, limited access to quality inputs, and weak market connectivity. The difficult terrain makes it harder to adopt mechanization and modern farming practices,

which results in unstable incomes and limited livelihood opportunities, especially for small and marginal farmers.

Understanding the specific challenges faced by these farming communities, a focused rural development initiative was introduced in Almora, Uttarakhand, under the Rural Development and Livelihood theme. Like many mountainous areas, this region struggles with limited arable land, unpredictable weather, poor soil health, and a shortage of modern agricultural resources. These factors contribute to low productivity and restricted income opportunities for local farmers.

To tackle these issues, the project promoted sustainable and climate-resilient farming practices suited to the geographical and ecological conditions of the Himalayan region.

Farmers received hands-on training in modern agricultural techniques, including terrace farming improvement, water-efficient irrigation, integrated pest management, and soil conservation.

The program placed special emphasis on organic inputs such as bio-fertilizers and natural pest repellents to improve soil fertility and reduce dependence on chemical fertilizers and pesticides.

The initiative also ensured farmers had access to high-quality seeds of crops suited to local climatic conditions,

offering better yields and higher resilience. Additionally, it encouraged crop diversification by introducing farmers to alternative crops with strong market demand and good nutritional value. Crops like millets, pulses, and herbs were promoted in place of traditional, low-yield staples.

To further support rural livelihoods, the project introduced allied income-generating activities such as vermicomposting, organic manure production, backyard poultry, and livestock rearing. These activities created additional sources of income for farmers and reduced their risk of financial losses due to crop failure or seasonal income gaps.

As a direct result of the initiative, ten farmers in Almora experienced noticeable improvements in their agricultural productivity.



Crop yields increased by up to 50 to 60 percent,

while input costs decreased using locally available, low-cost organic materials. Farmers also reported more stable and diverse income sources, leading to higher household incomes, improved food security, and stronger economic resilience.

This pilot project not only improved the lives of participating families but also demonstrated a scalable and practical model for sustainable rural development in hilly areas. It laid the groundwork for long-term agricultural improvement and empowered farmers to become leaders of change within their communities.

In the remote, hilly villages of Almora district in Uttarakhand, many people, especially the elderly, face difficulties in accessing quality healthcare due to long distances and the absence of nearby medical facilities.

To address this pressing issue, Team Computers Pvt. Ltd., in collaboration with Apollo Telemedicine Networking Foundation, launched the Swasthya Sanjeevani Kendra (Digital Dispensary) project.



This initiative established telemedicine centers in

14 villages,

making it possible for residents to consult doctors without leaving their communities. With the support of trained staff and digital tools, villagers can now avail themselves of regular medical checkups, video consultations with qualified doctors, and basic diagnostic services such as blood tests, urine tests, and HbA1c tests for diabetes management.

The project also conducts health awareness and outreach sessions, helping people learn about common illnesses and the importance of early medical intervention. So far,

over 3,000 people have directly benefited from the services,

receiving timely and affordable medical care close to home. The project has reduced the need for long, difficult travel to city hospitals and brought a sense of relief and safety to many families. By combining technology with compassion, the Swasthya Sanjeevani Kendra is making a lasting impact on the health and well-being of rural communities in Almora.

In recent years,

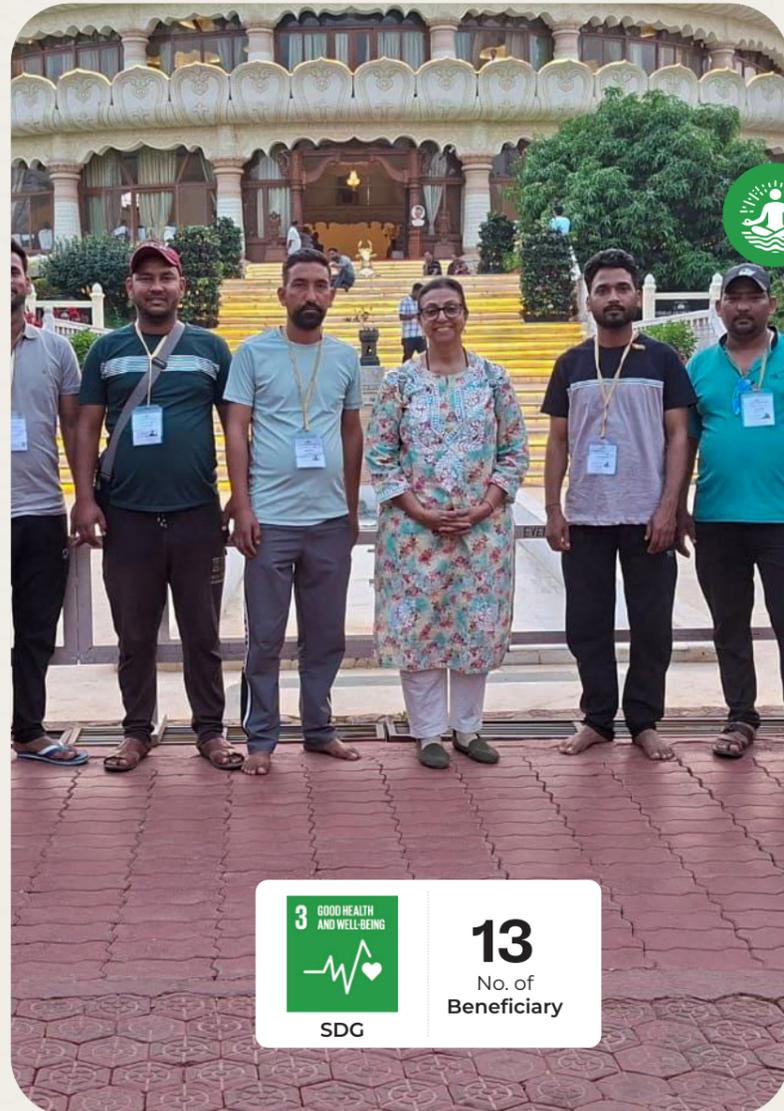
mental health concerns have become increasingly common due to rising stress, anxiety, and a lack of awareness about psychological well-being. In many communities, limited access to mental health resources and the stigma attached to seeking help have made the situation worse, often resulting in silent suffering and a lower quality of life.

To address these challenges, a wellness-focused intervention was introduced by SSRDP (Sri Sri Rural Development Programme) under the theme of promoting health care, including preventive health.

This initiative aimed to improve mental well-being through guided meditation sessions, stress-relief workshops, and holistic wellness programs.

These sessions were designed to nurture inner peace, emotional resilience, and psychological balance among participants. A total of 13 beneficiaries participated in this program and reported noticeable improvements in their mental well-being, emotional stability, and overall outlook on life.

The initiative not only helped reduce stress and anxiety but also encouraged the adoption of mindfulness practices and regular self-care, contributing to the growth of healthier and more emotionally resilient communities.

In many low-income communities, especially in rural and underserved urban areas, the arrival of winter brings serious health risks.

Families living in poorly insulated shelters often lack access to warm clothing and bedding, leaving them vulnerable to cold-related illnesses and discomfort.

This situation is particularly difficult for the elderly, children, and individuals with pre-existing health conditions. To address this issue, the Joy of Learning Foundation, with support from **Team Computers Pvt. Ltd.(TCPL)**, launched a winter relief initiative to assist vulnerable populations.

The effort involved distributing **105 warm blankets** to underprivileged individuals, providing immediate protection against harsh weather conditions.

This initiative helped ease the hardship faced by marginalized groups, improved their resilience to cold weather, and promoted overall well-being by reducing exposure to winter-related health concerns. It also reflected TCPL's ongoing commitment to inclusive healthcare support and compassion-driven community outreach.

Digital Literacy and Cyber Safety Education for School Children in Uttarakhand

Digital skills are essential today, yet many government school students in rural and border areas of Uttarakhand still face limited access to computers, internet, and online safety awareness.

To bridge this gap, Team Computers Pvt Ltd partnered with Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust to run a Digital Literacy and Cyber Safety Training Programme in 2024-25 across **17 government schools in Almora and Nainital**. Students learned basic computer skills, including MS Word, Excel, and PowerPoint, along with safe internet practices. Expert workshops, including a session by professionals from KPMG, added practical insights.

The programme reached over **5,000 students** and impacted nearly **90,000 people in 196 nearby villages**. It also included hygiene awareness for girls, mental wellness sessions, Vedic Math webinars, and inter school competitions.

Assessment scores improved from 24.55 percent to 79.25 percent. Students gained stronger digital skills, better awareness of online safety, and more interest in higher education and technology careers.

What Beneficiaries are Learning? Basic Digital Literacy Courses and Tally as Professional Course.

Many prison inmates face significant challenges when trying to rebuild their lives after release, largely due to limited access to education and practical skills while in prison. In Uttarakhand, correctional facilities offer very few programs to help inmates prepare for life outside. Without opportunities for digital literacy or vocational training, securing employment after release becomes difficult.

To address this need, Team Computers Pvt. Ltd. partnered with Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust to launch a Digital Literacy and Skill Development Program in five prisons located in Dehradun, Haldwani, Almora, Haridwar, and Tehri.

Through this initiative,
1,000 Inmates
received training in basic computer skills and a professional accounting software course, Tally.



The program taught inmates how to operate computers, navigate the internet, perform data entry tasks, and work with essential software.

Inmates were also provided with access to computers and guided practice sessions, allowing them to continue learning and build confidence in using digital tools.

As a result of this program, inmates acquired valuable skills, gained confidence, and became better prepared to reintegrate into society after their release.

The initiative not only improved their chances of finding stable employment but also contributed to creating a more positive, hopeful prison environment.

This effort actively supports broader social goals, including good health, quality education, and equal opportunities for all.

The Journey of Raman Bhardwaj



Raman Bhardwaj's journey is a powerful example of how learning and second chances can transform a life. Once imprisoned in Haridwar for a crime committed in a moment of anger, Raman spent 14 years reflecting on his actions. Even within the walls of confinement, he discovered a path forward and chose not to give up on himself.

With determination, Raman enrolled in the Digital Literacy and Skill Development Program supported by Team Computers Pvt Ltd and Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust (SSRDP).

He learned essential computer skills and successfully completed professional training in Tally, a widely used accounting software. His discipline, commitment to learning, and good behaviour led to his early release after serving 12 years. Instead of turning away from his past, Raman chose to use his experience to help others.

Today, he works as a trainer with HUM-SSRDP at Dehradun Prison,

where he teaches inmates the same digital and life skills that once gave him a new beginning. History continues to inspire fellow inmates to believe in personal growth and the possibility of change.

Raman also adopted stress-relieving practices such as yoga and meditation, which were introduced during the program. These techniques brought him mental peace and a positive outlook, helping him rebuild his life with purpose. His transition from despair to hope stands as a remarkable example of how education, inner strength, and supportive opportunities can lead individuals toward a new start.

Raman Bhardwaj's journey reflects the resilience of the human spirit and the lasting impact of rehabilitation programs in creating brighter futures for individuals, their families, and entire communities.
